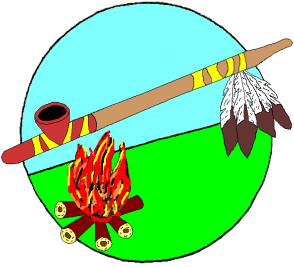

# Indian Council of Many Nations Scholarship Program

The Indian Council of Many Nations is offering two types of educational scholarships. Native students graduating high school and are attending their first semester of college. The second scholarship is for students entering a college or vocational school majoring in a technical field. The requirements for the scholarships are the simple and listed below.

To apply you must:

- 1) Be of Native American heritage.
- 2) Be a legal resident of the following counties\_ In Missouri: Clay, Jackson, Cass, Clinton, Lafayette, and Platte. In Kansas: Wyandott, Douglas, Leavenworth, Miami, and Johnson.
- 3) Have cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above on a 4.0 scale.
- 4) Technical Students- Be enrolled as a full-time class load student as defined by your admitting organization ( school ).
- 5) For High School to freshman college students-The student must be entering post-high school studies for the first time in their first semester (freshman in a four year college, two year college, or a vocational school).
- 6) Three letters of reference from acquaintances un-related to applicant.

Then:

- 1) Complete the application.(incomplete applications and essays will not be reviewed and will be returned to the applicant.
- 2) Complete and submit an essay about yourself, your heritage, some accomplishments and your educational goals, how you plan to achieve them. Answer the following questions- How my (applicant) life's experience, my Education and my career choice will prepare me to help my Native American community. What you feel are some of the problems facing the Indian People today and why you (applicant) think you should be chosen for This grant. The essay must be handwritten, double spaced and minimum of four pages.
- 3) Attach the following required documents:
  - a) Proof of residency
  - b) Proof of Native American lineal descent.(EX: CDIB, tribal registration or equivalent Documentation). The decision of the Scholarship Committee regarding acceptable proof is final.
  - c) Certified High School transcript containing final cumulative GPA and Letter of Admission from the qualifying post-graduate institution or school.
  - d) Documentation of current status of full time enrollment for technical students(col/voc).

All of the above must be completed, submitted and post-marked no later than July 1, of application year and sent to:
